


- A structural formula for Warfarin, an anticoagulant, showing all atoms and bonds is shown below. Draw a stick representation of the formula in the adjacent box.

- Consider the alkene, 2-methyl-2-butene (**B**).

When (**B**) is treated with hydrogen chloride in methanol, two carbocations can be formed. The major carbocation reacts with nucleophiles that are present in the reaction to give an alkyl halide and an ether.
